

Leading the Way with First Aid Training

A team from Mullingar First Responders visited St. Colman's in October to give the children some valuable basic First Aid training.

The volunteers, David Stafford and his team, piloted the initiative with talks in all classes from first through to sixth during four days of visits.

David was enthusiastic about this forward-thinking initiative as he would love to see the Irish school system come more in line with American schools where First Aid is taught as part of the national curriculum.

The team customised their talks for each class, giving more in-depth knowledge and information in line with their ages. For example, first class started with learning how to recognise an emergency and taking the fear out of picking up the phone and dialing 112. As he moved up the school through second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth classes, the educa-



tion got more detailed with David giving the team speaking about biology and the anatomy of the human body and the importance of trying to perform CPR or to run for a defibrillator because of the importance of keeping the heart working. As part of the training, classes were told that every single child should know their eircode and that in the event of an emergency the caller will be asked for their eircode for the First Responders to locate the emergency. David has kindly agreed to come back in term three to provide more First Aid, CPR and defibrillator training with the sixth classes.

Mrs. Walters expressed her determination to get a defibrillator provided for the school and local community, through fundraising and sponsorship.

As a thank you to David and the other volunteers on the team, the St. Colman's Student Council decided that funds raised through the Halloween Fancy Dress Day would go to the Mullingar First Responders as a token of our appreciation for their time.

However, the team were so heartened by the school's interest in the programme and our determination to fundraise for a defibrillator that they have asked that the money we fundraised in their name, totalling €524.35, be put towards a defibrillator that may be located at St. Colman's and made accessible to the local community. Further fundraising will take place to help us achieve our goal.

Back in September we distributed lists of what is and what isn't allowed in the children's school lunches and we are delighted to have parents on board with this initiative. It's been a great success so far and no doubt the children are already reaping the benefits.

Also, the school's Hot Lunches programme has been rolled out again this year with every child in the school having the option



of receiving a hot lunch delivered to their classroom each day. We recently sent home a plastic lunch box which is to be used each day for the children to bring home their hot lunch leftovers and box. The reasons for this initiative are two-fold: It will help us to reduce food waste in the school and will allow parents to monitor what their child is eating from the hot lunch and what the child likes and dislikes so that the parents can amend their orders accordingly. We hope this is beneficial to parents in terms of getting the best possible nutrition into their child to help keep them happy and healthy each school day!

TEACHING AND LEARNING

New Primary Maths Curriculum

The Primary Maths Curriculum has been revised for the first time in over 20 years. This is a welcome development with the objective being to offer a more engaging, playful and inclusive learning experience for all pupils.

Primary schools are currently familiarising themselves with the new curriculum and will work towards its implementation from September 2024. The Department

of Education are delivering support to all schools at present to help us prepare for this change and this will involve a school closure day for staff training in either term 2 or term 3.

We have not yet been provided with a date but we will advise parents as soon as we receive notice of this closure.

Ready Set Go Maths

In anticipation of the changes coming in the new Maths curriculum, our staff have undertaken training in the Ready Set Go Maths programme which is very much aligned with the vision and methodologies of the new curriculum.

Significant investment has been made by the Board of Manage-

ment in new Maths equipment to provide our infant classes with more opportunities to engage in playful learning and 'Maths Talk' each day.

This programme is currently being taught in Junior Infants and will be introduced to Senior Infants after Christmas.



Literacy

New literacy initiatives have been developed in the school in keeping with our ethos that 'a book is a dream which you hold in your hand'.

As a result of the successful book fair held in the school last year, over €2,000 worth of books were delivered to us in September helping restock the school library throughout the 19 classrooms and SET rooms.

Our new swap library is set to be in action before Christmas, with donated books gathered and sorted, book orders underway and wooden bookshelving being created by a local craftsman to complement our storyteller's chair.

DEAR (drop everything and read) time continues throughout the school as we continue to foster an environment where reading for pleasure is encouraged.

As part of our DEIS plan, one of our targets is to reestablish and affirm strong links with our County Library. The school is going to act as a middleman to organise membership for the children in advance of class visits to the library. It is hoped this initiative will support our ethos that reading is to be enjoyed by everyone.

We have had a great turn-out at our recent Parents Association meetings and preparations have now begun for our annual Christmas Fayre which takes place on December 3rd. We are actively seeking help to organise the event. 
